### ‘Little Shop of Horrors’ promises evening of BIG entertainment

April 25 and 26 are Red Letter Dates for the Drama department as director David Goodlett and his cast present the tale of a bloodthirsty plant and its plan to take over the world in “Little Shop of Horrors.”

This play, presented on Broadway in the 1980s, focuses on a nerdy shopkeeper who comes under the spell of a manipulative plant. Seymour is secretly in love with his co-worker Audrey but, of course, is too timid to express his feelings. However, as owner of the attention-getting Audrey II (named in honor of Seymour’s true love), Seymour becomes famous, but complications and consequences develop, and Seymour finds himself in a most uncomfortable plight.

The play features the talents of several students, including David Seelye as Seymour and Celeste McNamee as Audrey. Also in the cast are Kyle Bryan, Jack Manion, Evelyn Lear, Hannah Sprigg, Rachael Griffiths and Sara Wigginton.

The play begins at 7:30 each evening in the school gym.

### Juniors to spend April 9 on the job

Juniors will be on the job Wednesday, April 9 for the annual Junior Job Shadow Day. Coordinated by academic counselor Andy Hall and junior English teacher David Goodlett, this program allows the juniors to spend a day learning about possible career choices.

Juniors are matched with professionals in fields of interest. The students may develop their own job shadow connections, or Mr. Hall will help match them with professionals in their careers fields of interest.

This program is the culmination of helping the students determine which careers they are best suited for. Through standardized testing, students are given career profiles that list careers that match their interests and abilities. By exploring possible careers, students are better able to choose college majors and apply to colleges and universities that offer programs that match their career interests.

At the conclusion of the Job Shadow Day, the juniors have a writing assignment that allows them to focus on what they learned through the program.
